		Is there a complete, adequate, and realistic specification or purchase description is available?					
		Are two or more responsible bidders willing and able to compete effectively for the business?	2 CFR 200.320(b)(1)(i)				
		Does the procurement lend itself to a firm fixed price contract? Can the selection of the successful bidder be made principally based on price?					
	Requirement Checklist						
Sealed bids		Bids must be solicited from an adequate number of qualified sources, providing them sufficient response time prior to the date set for opening the bids, for local, and tribal governments, the invitation for bids must be publicly advertised;	2 CFR 200.320(b)(1)(ii)				
		The invitation for bids, which will include any specifications and pertinent attachments, must define the items or services for the bidder to properly respond;					
		All bids will be opened at the time and place prescribed in the invitation for bids, and for local and tribal governments, the bids must be opened publicly;					
		A firm fixed price contract award will be made in writing to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. Where specified in bidding documents, factors such as discounts, transportation cost, and life cycle costs must be considered in determining which bid is lowest. Payment discounts will only be used to determine the low bid when prior experience indicates that such discounts are usually taken advantage of; and					
		Any or all bids may be rejected if there is a sound documented reason.
