Recognition for **Dispatchers &** Animal Control Professionals

Will County Executive Bertino-Tarrant recognized sta[~] at t wo departments this month as part of national appreciation weeks. Sta[~] at L araway Communications Center (LCC) were recognized for National Public Safety Telecommunicator Week and the Will County Animal Control Department sta[~] were celebrated for Animal Care & Control Week.

Both LCC and Animal Control received Executive Proclamations, along with ice cream sandwiches, to thank them for their work and dedication to public service. Both departments play an important role in public safety throughout Will County.

For the sta[~] of LCC, their telecommunicators are the first points of contact for the public during an emergency. They speak to residents on their worst days and ensure that first responders are well-prepared to arrive on the scene to any situation.

The Will County Animal Control Department responds to call from residents regarding wild animals or lost pets – they receive approximately 3,500+ calls each year and last year took in 575 animals, some of which included ducks, horses, pigs, and sheep. This small-but-mighty department works hard for the wellbeing and safety of all creatures, human or otherwise, in the county.

Will County Launches Interactive Road Construction Map

The Will County Division of Transportation (WCDOT) has launched a new interactive online map to help residents stay up to date on county-wide construction projects. The map includes the 2023 Will County Road Construction Schedule, with multiple reconstruction, repaying, and improvement projects scheduled.

The new Construction Projects Interactive Map, developed by Will County's Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Division, will be updated throughout the year to reflect the status of construction projects. It is designed to help drivers plan their routes to possibly avoid roads under construction or plan for extra commute times. WCDOT urges commuters to try to avoid construction zones whenever possible to minimize congestion. When driving on these roadways, signs should be followed for partial lane closures and construction zone speed limits to help keep workers safe.

Each project includes information on the project, including estimated start date, estimated duration, anticipated tra_c c impact, and current project status. Check out the map to familiarize yourself with this year's construction project plans on Will County roadways!

DID YOU KNOW? - Defect detectors are placed along the tracks to measure variables in passing trains, which can be used as an early detection of potential failures like overheating during operation.
