County Executive Bertino-Tarrant joined local leaders to cut the ribbon on the completed Houbolt Road Extension, which is creating a direct route for commercial traffic between I-80 and the CenterPoint Intermodal Center.

This project, funded without taxpayer funds, has been supported by Will County leaders for over a decade. It will reduce truck traffic on local roads, especially for Joliet and Channahon residents. Will County is continuing to work with the Illinois Department of Transportation and local governments on identifying improvements to improve safety and reduce congestion in this area.
