Expanding Pedestrian & Bicycle Access in Joliet Township

Will County Executive Jennifer Bertino-Tarrant joined officials from the Forest Preserve District of Will County to accept a check for \$1.1 million in federal funding from U.S. Rep. Bill Foster to create expanded pedestrian and bicyclist access in Joliet Township.

This funding will develop a 1.34-mile trail to create a connection between Route 53 in the Preston Heights neighborhood to the Wauponsee Glacial Trail, the District's longest path. Coupled with a planned bike path along Route 53, this project will create expanded connectivity for residents to local services and the sprawling regional rail systems, including the Old Plank Road Trail, I&M Canal Trail, and the 20,083-acre Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie.

The trail project, known as the "Wauponsee Glacial Trail to Route 66 Bikeway Project," was first identified by Will County as a priority in the 2017 Sugar Run Creek Area Neighborhood Plan. Seeing the value in expanding pedestrian-friendly infrastructure in the unincorporated areas south of the City of Joliet, County Executive Bertino-Tarrant partnered with the Forest Preserve District to request federal funding from Rep. Foster and Sen. Durbin in the Fiscal year 2023 Federal Budget.

RNG Plant Makes First Sale

Will County has received its first payment from sales of the natural gas produced by the county-owned Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Plant located at Prairie View Landfill. The county has received a \$2.15 Million purchase of gas from the plant, which converts landfill gas into a conventional natural gas that can be sold and distributed externally.

The Will County RNG Plant, located near Wilmington, first started operations in Fall 2022 and is generating about \$38,000 a day in revenue. The gas produced at the plant is sold on the open market as transportation fuel, mostly for heavy commercial vehicles. As an alternative fuel for energy-efficient vehicles, the gas sold from the RNG plant will power the equivalent of 150 million miles traveled annually.

The RNG Plant project began with a vision to maximize the financial benefits of Will County's ownership of Prairie View Landfill. The self-sustaining plant is projected to raise millions of dollars for Will County capital projects through both the sale of gas and credits paid for by fossil fuel providers.



Making an Impact

Throughout May and June, the Will County Executive office has been partnering with multiple local organizations to host free food giveaway events in Joliet. In total, nearly 1,000 vehicles were served with free produce, vegetables, and protein at these three events, feeding thousands of Will County residents.
