Using the allocation of over \$134 million from the American Rescue Plan, the County will soon be opening the application period for Economic Development programs to support recovery.

On November 1st, Will County will open the application period for **Economic Development Programs** that address the negative economic impacts of the pandemic and provide direct aid to industries impacted by the pandemic. Applications will be open until December 22, 2022.

On October 21st, I joined Will County Board Speaker Mimi Cowan and County Board members to cut the ribbon on Will County's newest example of innovation: Our new Renewable Natural Gas (RNG) Plant.

Located next to the county-owned Prairie View Landfill in Wilmington, the RNG Plant will capture and repurpose methane gas produced by the landfill. The County will clean the gas and sell it on the open market as renewable natural gas, which will be utilized as a clean fuel for large-scale transportation vehicles.

This visionary project began as an idea within the Will County Land Use Department as an opportunity to maximize the benefits of owning Prairie View Landfill. The self-sustaining plant is projected to raise millions of dollars for Will County. I'm also proud to say that this project invested in our local economy: 96% of construction was performed by local companies and 44% by Will County residents.

This project solidifies our role as a clean energy leader in Illinois. This is only the second plant of its kind in the state and the first in Chicagoland. I look forward to sharing more information about the benefits of this forward-thinking investment.
